

Background (1)

 More than 90% of new ships of the world is built by Asian Shipbuilders.



Background (2)

- Various IMO Conventions & Guidelines have made serious impacts on Shipbuilding industry.
- Asian shipbuilders should pay attention to the IMO more and more.

Background (3)

78 NGOs in IMO at present

- However, many of them from shipping, machinery, paintings, ports, university etc.

2 of 78 are representing Shipbuilding Industry; CESA and SYBAss

- CESA is a community of shipbuilders' associations in Europe
- SYBAss is related to building of large & luxury yachts (A Taiwanese builder is a member, while all others are from Europe, USA or Oceania)
- ✓ No proper NGOs in IMO relating to building of cargo ships (Oil tankers, Bulk carriers, Container ships, etc.)
- ✓ Asian shipbuilders, which build more than 90% of world new ships should go to IMO

Study regarding IMO's provisions on NGOs in consultative status with IMO

(1)Responsibilities, privileges, advantages and disadvantages of NGO in consultative status with IMO, and conditions for obtaining and maintaining the status

Subjects of study regarding IMO's provisions on NGOs and existing NGOs

Study regarding existing NGOs such as CESA, IACS, ICS, BIMCO, etc.

- (2)Listing up of existing NGOs in consultative status with IMO (79 NGOs)
- (3) Activities in IMO etc. (regular and irregular activities)
- (4) Member eligibility, approval of accession and withdrawal, and dismissal procedure
- (5)Structure of the organization, staffs and secretariat
- (6)Method of electing chairman, secretary general, secretariat etc. in charge of IMO related affairs and their terms of office
- (7) Method of decision making, revision of organization codes, approval of budget etc.
- (8)Countries where headquarters / branches (e.g.: Representative office in London) should be located (registered), and regulations, tax system
- (9) Required operating cost (project cost, administrative cost, employment cost, etc.)
- (10) Method of calculating each country's share of contributions to the operating cost

Imaging of a structure of an organization representing Shipbuilding / Shiprepairing industry in Asia as an IMO-NGO

A structural plan or plans (i.e., alternatives, if necessary) are to be prepared to image the most desirable structure of ASEF that will act as an IMO-NGO in case an agreement is reached by the member countries of ASEF about pursuing NGO status.

(Note) Scope of the CG is just studying IMO-NGO status, and any decision-making is out of the scope of the CG.

IMO's Provision

With respect to the IMO's provisions on NGOs in consultative status with IMO, the following documents are found:

- Rules governing relationship with Nongovernmental International Organizations (hereinafter referred to as Rules) and;
- .2 Guidelines on the grant of consultative status (hereinafter referred to as Guidelines).

IMO's Provision

Privileges

(Rule 6 of the Rules)

- the right to receive the provisional agenda for sessions of the meetings of IMO;
- The right to submit written statements on items of the agenda of the meetings of IMO;
- The right to be represented by an observer at the meetings of IMO; and
- The right to receive the texts of resolutions adopted by the meetings of IMO.

(Rule 7 of the Rules)

- Normally one observer from each NGO shall be admitted to any session or meeting; and
- Such observer shall have no voting rights but may speak on any item of the agenda.

IMO's Provision

Responsibilities

(Rule 4 of the Rules)

- To support the activities of IMO; and
- To promote the dissemination of its principles and work, bearing in mind the objectives and functions of IMO.

(Rule 8 of the Rules)

- To keep the Secretary-General of IMO currently informed of those aspects of its own activities which are likely to be of interest to IMO; and
- To accord to IMO privileges corresponding to those which are granted to it by IMO.

IMO's Provision

Requirements

(Rule 1 of the Rules)

A substantial contribution to the work of IMO

(Rule 3 of the Rules and paragraph I of the guidelines)

- The activity of NGO concerned is related directly to the purposes of IMO as defined in Article 1 of the IMO Convention; and
- The objects and functions of NGO are fully in harmony with the spirit, functions and principles of IMO.

(Rule 5 of the Rules and paragraph IV of the guidelines)

- A permanent headquarters;
- A governing body;
- An executive officer;
- Truly international with members, component branches or affiliated bodies in a sufficient number of countries; and
- Authorization under its constitution to speak for its members through accredited representatives.

• IMO's Provision

Requirements

(Paragraph II of the guidelines)

- It is not a member of, affiliated to, or otherwise associated with another organization which enjoys consultative status or has other form of association with IMO; and
- The interest or interests it purports to represent are not represented in IMO through another organization.

(Paragraph III of the guidelines)

 No duplication or conflict. In particular, no grant of consultative status shall be made where each of two or more rival organizations purports to represent a particular interest to the exclusion of the others.

• IMO's Provision

Procedures

(Rule 9 of the Rules)

- The Council of IMO shall only consider applications for consultative status from NGOs once a year; and
- The Council of IMO shall not consider re-applications from such organizations until at least two years have elapsed since the Council took a decision on the original application.

(Rule 10 of the Rules)

 The Council of IMO shall review the list of NGOs, in order to determine whether the continuance of their status in any particular case is necessary and desirable and shall report to the Assembly of IMO accordingly.
