Closing address by Mr. Nobuyoshi Aikawa, President, Japan Ship Technology Research Association (JSTRA) at the 7th ASEF (November 8, 2013)

My name is Nobuyoshi Aikawa, and I am from the Japan Ship Technology Research Association. On behalf of the organizers, I would like to say a few words to mark the end of the 7th Asian Shipbuilding Experts' Forum (ASEF).

I would like to thank everyone for all their hard work at this event. I believe our discussions over the past two days have further deepened the friendships and mutual understanding that we as Asian shipbuilders enjoy.
